Muse Entertainment Enterprises and Sound Venture Productions in association with the Outdoor Life Network are casting paradise seekers for an exotic adventure

Paradise Seekers is the latest reality-based, docu-soap series coming to television. The show is casting now. Paradise Seekers is planning to take beautiful people looking for romance to exotic locations. The first OPEN casting call is in Toronto on November 6-7, 2000. The half-hour television series will be broadcast on the Outdoor Life Network in Canada. Production begins this week. People must be 18-35 years old and want a chance at love, romance and stardom. They must have a valid Canadian passport and be prepared to be on-camera while vacationing on a tropical isle.

"We will take our paradise seekers to an all expenses paid-resort, and let them loose. Our cameras will record their every move. What happens is anyone's guess, and everybody's business," says series Producer Katherine Jeans. The first group of Paradise Seekers heads to Runaway Bay, Jamaica on December 4th, 2000 and the next group goes to Super Club Breezes, Bahamas. Paradise Seekers is a cross between Survivor, Blind Date and National Geographic Presents. The exotic adventure is a co-production of Sound Venture Productions of Ottawa and Muse Entertainment Enterprises of Montreal in association with OLN. The location of the first open casting call is The Docks Bar, 11 Polson Street, Toronto, 11 am to 6pm on Monday, November 6th and Tuesday, November 7th.

Sound Venture specializes in the creation of high-quality arts, cultural and documentary programming. It produces 25-30 hours of television a year. It is well known for the television series The Toy Castle, Homes by Design and Get A Life.

Muse Entertainment Enterprises is a film and television production company with affiliates Pebblehut Productions in Toronto, Dogwood Pictures in Vancouver and Muse Productions in Montreal.
